Forklift Seats - A seat is a strong, strong surface to sit upon, usually raised above floor level. Typically utilized by one person, nearly all seats are supported by four legs, even if several could be in a triangular shape using only three legs. A stool is a kind of seat that does not have any arm rests or a back rest. A seat which has folding action and an inclining footrest is known as a recliner, while a seat with arms only is considered an arm seat. When a seat has attached wheels, it could be referred to as a wheelseat and if the seat is hung from above, it is called a swing. A permanently attached seat in a theatre or a train is called a seat or airline seat, yet when riding; it is a saddle as in bicycle saddle. A car seat is the type utilized inside vehicles and an infant car seat will be a seat specially meant for little kids.

A seat design can differ so as to accommodate many various requirements and aesthetic tastes. For example, the design could be decorated with drilled holes, be made of porous materials or include a low back or gaps for ventilation. The seat back may be designed as an included headrest by means of extending the height over the occupant's head. Seats may be made along with an attached, built in footrest or come with a separate matching ottoman. An ottoman is a short stool which is intended to be utilized as a movable footrest. Sometimes the ottoman could be connected to a glider chair with swing arms, allowing the ottoman to rock back and forth with the glider similar to a rocking chair with a built-in footrest.

Covers utilized for seats are temporary fabric covers offering protections against wear or to offer better aesthetics. Currently on the market there are a large range of seat covers from leather to neoprene. More formal materials could be rented for events such as weddings to increase the decoration. Some seat covers have decorative seat ties or ribbons connected to be tied at the rear of the seat in a bow or decorative knot. Several folks utilize customized clear plastic furniture covers to protect their expensive seats and sofas.

Seat pads offer cushioning for hard seats, though a few are usually decorative. Some can even be used so as to increase a driver's height within vehicles. Also, orthopaedic backrests supply lumbar and lower spine support. Various producers have their seat pad designs patented and are recognized by certain medical associations. A few of the newer car seats on the market are outfitted along with built-in and adjustable lumbar supports in order to offer additional comfort to passengers as well as drivers of the vehicle.
